

Guidance for pupils returning to school: COVID-19

To help keep you and everyone else safe, the following measures have been put into place.

Please order a packed lunch from school if possible. If lunches are usually free this will continue.

When coats are needed, these will be kept on your own chair. Labels please

Bring in your own, labelled water bottle.

Don't bring in any bags from home.

You will be told to regularly and carefully wash your hands for 20 seconds. Ensure you know how to.

You must wear your school uniform and trainers that you can fasten yourself. Grown ups won't be able to help.

Desks will be kept as far apart as possible and you will need to stay at your desk unless you have permission from an adult to move.

Your parents will need to socially distance when dropping you off and you may be told use a different gate. Parents will not be allowed on site.

We will give you all the resources that you need. No sharing!

Bring in an umbrella; a small pack of tissues; and a small lidded pot for used tissues!

Only 1 child at a time will be allowed to go to the toilet. You must ask the grown ups if you need to go.

Moving around school will be different with new rules.

No bikes or scooters.

You may be taught a different teacher or TA.



You will have to be super at doing what you are told!

There will be some new rules to help us be safe. You must keep them.

We will try to give you as much time outside as we can to learn or have a break.

Break times will be staggered throughout the day and in specific parts of the play-grounds. You will not be able to play closely with your friends.

School will feel a little different to normal. Your grown ups will help you with this.

You will need to stay in the area you are told to and you will need to social distance.

Remember grown ups will need to social distance.

You will not be able to touch anyone else or their things

They may need to wear a mask and gloves if you are unwell or hurt

Code of conduct




You must do as you are asked by adults

In class, stay at your desk and keep your belongings to yourself

If you need help, put up your hand and wait.

At all times keep 2 metres away from other children and adults .



Avoid touching your face, mouth, nose and eyes

Use tissues and bin them -
for emergencies sneeze/cough into your elbow)



You must ask to use the toilets and the number using them at a time will be limited.

Wash your hands with soap for 20 sec regularly—you will be told to many times!



Only bring to school the things you have been asked to.

Children's equipment

School uniform, inc named sun hat

Small pack of tissues

Named water bottle

As needed, a named coat or extra layer

Please apply sun cream before school.

Trainers or equivalent (that they can fasten)

Named small lidded plastic pot - for used tissues (e.g. margarine pot)

Umbrella (for rain or shine especially lining up to be collected)

Pre ordered lunches/ small sprayable lunch pack.

Return to school check list
Is my child well ?
Check which days my child is in
Check school times and arrange to be on time
Check equipment list
Have lunches been preordered?
Have I told school if my child won't be attending when expected?
Check you can get to school within 1/2 hour if your child is ill.

If your child is upset about coming back to school and has difficulty separating from you, then you may be asked to take them home and try the next day.
