London's Burning is a rhyme about the Great Fire of London. Can you make a song or rhyme of your own? Perform it and record to send on Seesaw.

Imagine you were living in London in 1666. Write a diary entry about how you might have felt, and what was happening around you.

Create a piece of artwork about the Great Fire. You could make a collage, a drawing or painting of the Great fire. Think about the houses, smoke, river, people etc.

Write some Great Fire of London addition word problems. E.g. 7 houses are on fire and 5 more catch fire. How many houses are on fire altogether?

Talk to the adults at home about a fire plan for your house. Do you have one? Do you know what it is and what to do if there was a fire? What number would you call?
